APPENDIX E - ACCEPTABLE VETERAN VERIFICATION DOCUMENTS

PART I. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION FOR VETERANS.

- 1. Supporting documentation of veteran status. Show that the applicant is the descendent of a wartime U.S. military veteran who served honorably on active duty during at least one of the periods of war officially designated as eligibility dates for American Legion membership they must provide the following documents as proof.
- 2. Minimum requirements of documentation. All documents for veterans must show proof of honorable service on federal active duty during the designated periods of service. While documents may have personally identifiable information redacted such as birth date, social security number, service number, or serial number; however, information such as name, period of service, branch of service, and characterization of service must be legible for the document to be valid.
 - a. Period of service. The veteran from whom the applicant is descendent must have served on federal active duty in the United States Armed Forces between April 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 or since December 7, 1941, and have been honorably discharged or are still serving.
 - b. Service on federal active duty. The American Legion recognizes multiple means of fulfilling the active-duty statute. Members of the reserve component of a service branch or a member of the national guard are not eligible. The service-member must service on active-duty for at least one day.
 - i. Members of the armed forces as outlined in title 10 U.S. Code.
 - ii. Members of the U.S. Coast Guard as outlined in title 14 U.S. Code, Subtitle II.
 - iii. Members of the U.S. Merchant Marines as outlined in title 46 U.S. Code, Subtitle V between December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946.
 - Characterization of service.
 - i. A service-member, who did not die on active-duty, when released from service has his/her period of service characterized. This *character of service* determines your eligibility for benefits. There are 6 types of *discharge of character* listed on military discharges:
 - (1) Honorable or Under honorable conditions
 - (2) General under Honorable Conditions
 - (3) Other than Honorable (OTH)
 - (4) Bad Conduct (BCD)
 - (5) Dishonorable (DD)
 - (6) Entry Level (ELS) or Non-Characterized.
 - ii. The service Characterization of Honorable or General under Honorable Conditions are the

only acceptable characterization for descendants of eligible veterans for this scholarship.

- iii. For those who die on active-duty, characterization of service is not a required component.
- **3.** Acceptable Documentation. A complete listing of acceptable documents is shown in table E-1 and E-2 below.
- 4. Means of assistance in obtaining documentation. There are many approaches in obtaining documentation that has been lost or from family members who are deceased.
 - a. Many certificates of discharge prior to 1979 do not appear to be "official" documents as many were typed onto a sheet of paper. If you are unsure if it is an official document, please ask your American Legion service officer. Department Service Officers are listed by state at www.legion.org/serviceofficers/.
 - b. The National Archives and Records Administration at <u>www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records/index.html.</u>
 - c. The County Clerk and Recorders Office where the veteran resided.
 - d. The funeral home may have kept a copy if military honors were provided.
 - e. Monument company if VA headstone or marker was ordered.
 - f. If the veteran had utilized a VA Home Loan there may be a copy of the DD form 214 with the title documentation.
 - g. Veterans who have signed up for EBENEFITS through the Veterans Administration may be able to obtain a printable copy from www.ebenefits.va.gov/ebenefits-portal/ebenefits.portal.
 - h. The State Director of Veterans Affairs may have received a copy of the veteran's DD form 214 at the time of discharge from military service. This will be specific to the state that is the veteran's home of record.

PART II. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION FOR CURRENT ACTIVE-DUTY STATUS.

1. **Minimum requirements of documentation.** All documents for active-duty service-members must show proof of service on federal active duty.

2. Documents include:

- a. Current, unexpired, military ID Card DoD Common Access Card. While the service number and birthdate may be redacted, the other information must be legible.
- b. Current Leave and Earning Statement (LES) within 6 months old. While the service number, amounts listed in entitlements, deductions, allotments, or summary may be redacted as well as bank details or the specifics of allotments; information such as the name, pay date, ETS, branch, period covered, and the pay types in entitlements and deductions blocks must be visible.
- c. Memorandum from current commanding officer indicating that the service-member is currently on active-duty and in good standing.
